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Introduction

The Armed Forces provide a variety of services for children, young people and families across Scotland. These include services provided by serving personnel, volunteers and community groups affiliated to the Armed Forces.

Many areas in Scotland have Cadet Forces, Army/Navy/RAF Welfare Services, Community Youth Services, Housing Support Services, Adventure Training Facilities and Recruitment Teams. All of these projects/services provide opportunities for contact with children, young people and/or families. It is often in these informal and non-statutory areas of work that children disclose or present with signs of abuse or neglect.

Whilst many Child Protection Committees actively encourage Service and Associated Personnel to attend local Child Protection courses, other areas have yet to establish points of contact within the Armed Forces locally.

Armed Forces and Associated Personnel should be clear that it is 'Everyone's Responsibility to Protect Children' and ensure they have the adequate knowledge and skills to actively identify and respond to concerns about children and young people. The Scottish Government recommends that anyone who has regular contact with children and young people undertakes some child protection training.

This booklet outlines training available for Forces personnel within each CPC area in Scotland. It also provides contact details of your local Child Protection Training link should you require any further advice or assistance.
